Special Guest, Derrick Thompson, City Council	 Councilman Thompson's term began on January 1, 2020 Phone number: 914-840-4024 Email: dthompson@cmvny.com The City Council works collaboratively with the Mayor and Comptroller. There is an initiative to develop a Comprehensive Plan, which will be a framework to the City's vision, zoning expectations and a guideline to fix decades of neglect in infrastructure and processes. Members recommended that the 2014 plan be reviewed and leveraged instead of starting from scratch, especially since it included input from the community. He is the Chair of HR. This is the link to view the other Council members, their area of responsibility, contact information and term expiration dates. He would also like to add pictures in the future -> http://cmvny.com/city-council/. Three Council seats will be open in the 2021 election (Janice, Marcus & Delia). In addition, the Comptroller's position will be open in the 2021 election. He reminded the members that Mount Vernon is a large city with 77k residents. Although it sounds like a substantial amount of money is collected from taxes, it is budgeted for 16 schools (the average number of schools/per town in Westchester is 3). The budget that was recently passed includes 1.97% increase in taxes, partial payments for those on fixed income, and raises for Commissioners in order to retain qualified individuals.

	Feedback based on questions addressed to Councilman Thompson:		
	 If neighbors see postings on trees or light posts about buying homes for cash, they should tear it down. One neighbor recommended that the City look into a Cease and Desist program that prohibits unwanted solicitation -> https://www.dos.ny.gov/licensing/ceaseanddesist/ceaseanddesistFAQ.html 		
	 Citizen Tree program should work with Councilwoman Delia Farquharson 		
	 He is unfamiliar with the Urban Renewal Agency corruption issues. It was mentioned that a decision was made to freeze activities at this time. He will find out who are the Board Members and report back to Axel and/or Jane. 		
	 He agreed that Public Relations efforts are necessary to improve Mount Vernon's reputation. Other cities and towns in Westchester have issues that are not published by the press.

They can notify the Officers when new neighbors move in, about abandoned properties, relay complaints to the Officers, and keep their block up-to-date on meetings. We're looking for volunteers for Darwood Avenue, Lincoln Avenue, North Columbus Avenue and Willard Avenue. A meeting with Block Captains will be scheduled in early Spring. 		



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Department of Buildings	 There is currently one (1) Building Inspector. As a result, there is a backlog on permits and inspections. We are gathering a list of issues to discuss with the new Building Commissioner and encourage everyone to provide their issues that need to be addressed. We will continue to be diligent about any landlords participating in the NYC has a Special One-Time Assistance (SOTA) program, which was rumored for 321 E. Sidney Avenue. When the new Commissioner is announced, we will discuss the strategy for abandoned homes.
